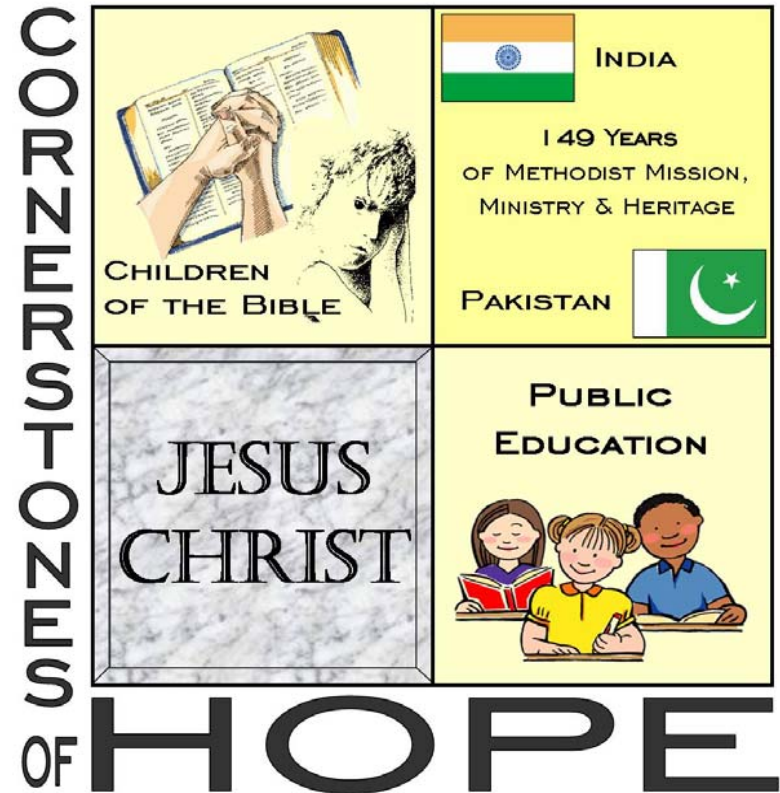

CORNERSTONES OF HOPE

Experience tells any builder that a building depends on its cornerstone. Without it, the structure weakens and falls. When God confronted our ancestors to be faithful, Isaiah used the cornerstone as a symbol of justice. Building up the people of faith rests on justice and righteousness.

...therefore says the Lord God, "See, I am laying in Zion a foundation stone, a tested stone, a precious cornerstone, a sure foundation: 'One who trusts will not panic.' I will make justice the line, and righteousness the plummet..."
(Isaiah 28:16-17)

Jesus, the cornerstone the builders rejected, is our foundation as we build a future based on lessons from the past. India-Pakistan was a cornerstone of mission as our foremothers founded Clara Swain Hospital in 1869, which still stands as a mission agency funded by United Methodist Women. Schools were the next priority. Today we continue to promote education as we explore the challenges of public education in the United States. Finally, the painful stories of children of the Bible resonate with children's lives today and remind us that Jesus put children at the center of the Gospel.

Paul describes a future built on Jesus as the cornerstone and the apostles and prophets as the foundation:

So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone. In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling place for God. (Ephesians 2:19-22)

Our mission studies, Children of the Bible, Public Education and India/Pakistan, compel us to build a future of justice and righteousness for all children so that each generation is born into abundant life.

None will be called stranger or alien.
All will be citizens of the household of God
