Harvesting Peace

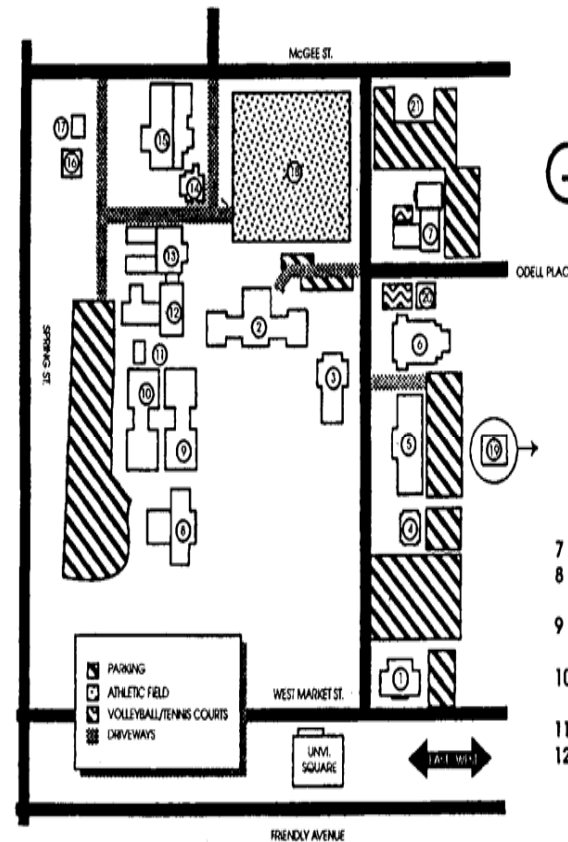
2006 SCHOOL OF CHRISTIAN MISSION THEME

“Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you.” These are words of Jesus communicated to us through the gospel of John. How have we used the gift of peace that Jesus gave to us?
