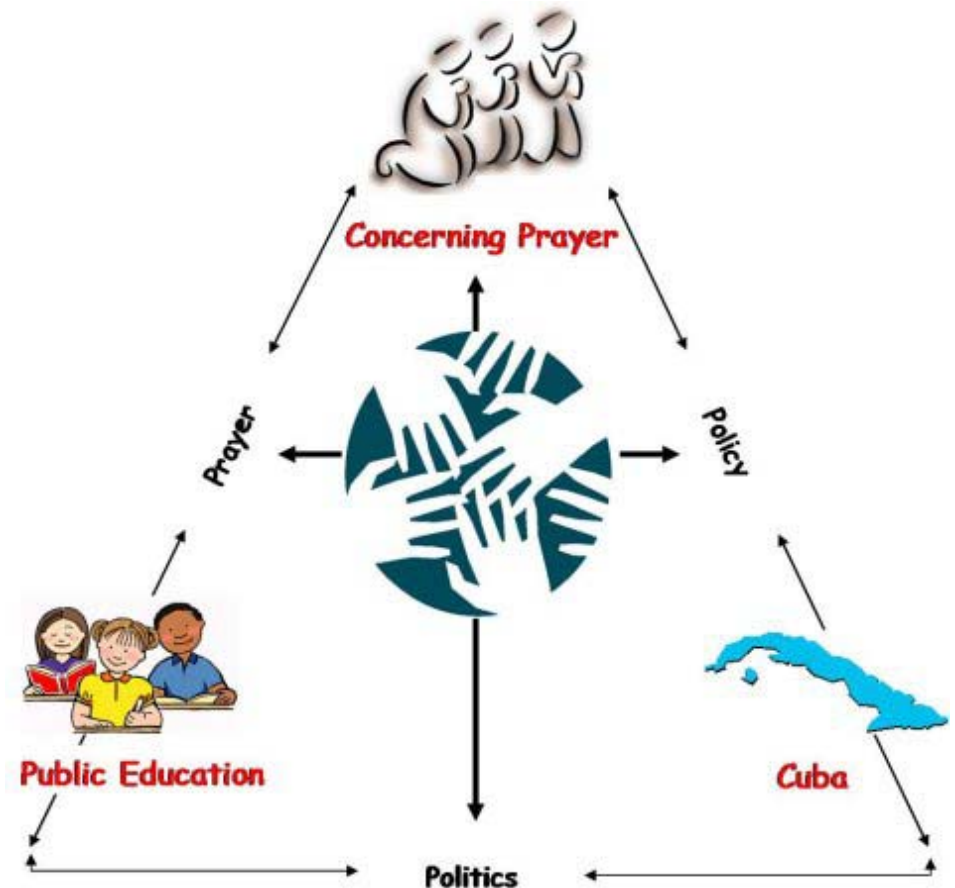

## Prayer, Policy, and Politics

Paul calls us to “pray without ceasing.” We pray for many things – peace, guidance, courage, strength, understanding and wisdom. We pray selfishly for what we want and unselfishly to accept what God wants for us.

As we pray for others, we remember God’s children in Cuba. Many times we have acted unjustly toward our island neighbors. We have erected barriers which have prevented us from learning more about them. We have enacted an embargo that has brought much suffering to all people of Cuba. God calls us to love one another – to seek points of reconciliation.

As times changed with the break-up of the Soviet Union and the end of the Cold War in the 90’s, we entered a new millennium with a sense of hope. In the 21st Century, let us be instruments of God’s will. May we find ways to build bridges to our Cuban brothers and sisters, as we pray for peace with our neighbors.

Proverbs 22:6 exhorts us to “Teach a child how he (she) should live; and he (she) will remember it all of his (her) life.” Education has always been of value to the individual, to society, and to civilization. Through education we pass on information and skills that enable people to earn a living. We teach lessons that enable people to live together. We pass on an understanding and appreciation of the world that helps people enjoy and take care of God’s creation. Each child is a treasure of much worth and should be given opportunities for education and training. As Christians, we have a responsibility to ensure that all children are given equal access to the tools for learning.

These studies will call us to be open to God’s leading, to nurture a relationship with Cuban Christians, and to provide our children an opportunity for a quality future.

In the section of the Book of Discipline entitled “Our Doctrinal Heritage,” we find a statement on **Mission and Service** which states: “We (United Methodist) insist that personal salvation always involves Christian mission and service to the world. Scriptural holiness entails more than personal piety: love of God is always linked with love of neighbor, a passion for justice, and renewal in the life of the world.”
